- In order to park as a group at FRVA events I must coordinate with the parking director and reserve the correct # of sites a month ahead of time. The alternative is parking randomly with 4000 big rigs or having all of us meet at the exact same time in the holding area and be escorted in as a group. RIGHT. NOT.

Check calendar and newsletter region Notes. Sign up quickly. Deadline for Rocky Mountain High Chapter Meeting end of May.

For Meet-Ups: Someone picks a place and you are responsible for your expenses and your campsite.

For rallies:

Campgrounds usually control the camp site business. Rally leader usually controls the fees for food, entertainment, etc. (Needs to be 10 or more roadtreks to qualify for a treasury stippen of \$25.00 per Roadtrek toward the costs involved.)

"Rocky Mountain High 2025" Roadtrek Chapter Meeting and Rally Sunday July 20th till Thursday July24th (With options to reserve another night or so)

Hurry....., Deadline.

You only have till May 30th to get your guaranteed campsite with the rest of us.

If you miss the deadline all campsites are open to the general public and many of them are more expensive. July is Prime time in the Rockies.

For the first time in over seventeen years we are having a rally in Colorado. We are camping next to the Big Thompson River just outside the city of Loveland, Colorado. (Elevation 4997ft. above sea level) Besides having a relaxing, forested, campsite near the river to breath in the mountain air; you also have plenty of activities to explore. There are about 36 breweries in the immediate area, Colorado State University, a Free 10 acre Sculpture Park with 178 pieces. 20 minutes away in Fort Collins, you can see large sculptures, painted pianos, 400 creatively painted city transformer cabinets, and Old Town Main Street that inspired the design for Disneyland Main Street. Also, there is a Totally 80's Museum and Pizza place and a 1919 style restored Trolley to ride. If you like biking, there is an amazing network of bike trails.

1. SECURE YOUR CAMPING SPACE AT Riverview RV Park and Campground.

Get your reservations as soon as possible. July is prime camping season in Colorado; the campgrounds fill up fast. You must CALL the campground and secure your spot where all the Roadtreks are parking for Sun. July 20th thru Wed. July 23rd. Their office hours are: <u>Mon.Wed. Thur. Fri. Sat. Sun, 9am till 5pm.</u> If you have to leave a message they do call back. If you go on line and look at the campground you will see that many sites are taken. Some campsites are posted as taken because I have them tentatively reserved for YOU. I will have to relinquish them to the public end of May.

You could extend your camping for Thursday and Friday and drive 50 minutes up to 7522 ft. above sea level to the town of Estes Park and the entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park. You can drive another 45 minutes to the highest visitor center in our National Park system, (11,796 ft. above sea level.) (Rocky Mountain National Park requires reservation times to enter the park. Website is: recreation.gov or make reservations using the recreation.gov mobile app (you will need to plan about 4 to 6 hours for your National Park Day, especially if you want to explore the town of Estes Park also.)

2. PAY YOUR RALLY FEE AND SEND CHECK AND RALLY REGISTRATION TO CHRIS OBERHOFFER:
